WATER AND SANITATION INDUSTRY UPDATES: JANUARY 2024

The start of 2024 brings continued transformation within the water and sanitation sector. Global pressures, technological advancements, and rising consumer awareness are shaping new trends and solutions. Here's a look at key developments:

1. Drought, Demand, and the Push for Alternative Sources

Intensifying drought conditions, particularly in the Global South, continue to put a strain on traditional water resources. In response:



TIPS & ADVICES UNDERSTANDING YOUR BILL



1.Know the Tariffs:

Familiarize yourself with ELDOWAS's water tariffs. This will help you understand how your bill is calculated. You can likely find this information on our website



2. Read Your Meter:

Learn how to read your water meter to track your consumption and better understand your usage patterns. Customers are encouraged to read their meters, especially when they receive their current bill, to enable them to track their consumption. However, denying authorized staff access to read the meter is illegal.

3. Query Unusual Bills:

If you notice a sudden spike in your water bill, contact ELDOWAS customer service to inquire – there could be a leak you are unaware of or an error in the reading.
